The “Good for Oregon” Committee Announces Partnership Group *Investments Coming to Oregon*

The “Good for Oregon” committee announces today the formation of a partnership group to create Oregon’s **first tax-paying casino** at the former Multnomah Greyhound Park in Wood Village, Oregon.

Bruce Studer and Matt Rossman have pursued a plan to develop a world-class Resort Casino and Entertainment Center that includes passage of two ballot measures that will:

- **Create Jobs.** Thousands of construction and permanent jobs.
- Dedicate **millions of dollars in annual revenues to benefit k-12 public education** across the state.
- Generate **new revenue to be shared with every county.**
- **Not use any taxpayer dollars** to build, operate or regulate the facility.

“This partnership group is committed to the building and operating of the Resort Casino and Entertainment Center the Oregon way -- constructed by local union craftspeople using local suppliers, and incorporating state-of-the-art green building techniques,” says Matt Rossman, co-founder of Oregon Gaming & Entertainment Co., LLC.

“We are excited to be working with this team, working together, investing in Oregon’s future,” said Jeff Parr, Co-CEO & Managing Director of Clairvest.

The partnership group includes:

- Oregon Gaming & Entertainment Co., LLC, principals Studer & Rossman – The Oregon-based company promoting investment in Oregon.
- MGP Racing, LLC, principal Arthur McFadden, Multnomah Greyhound Park.
- Navegante Group – An experienced hospitality company specializing in casino development, consulting and management.
- Clairvest - An international leader in investments in profitable North American companies with a proven track record in gaming development.
- Innovation Capital – A leading gaming, leisure and hospitality investment banking firm.

The group is in discussions to add additional partners, including those from Oregon.

The partnership group started signature gathering today. The measures will be on the November 2, 2010 ballot.
